## Goals and Expectations

8th Grade Handbell Ensemble is open to students in grade 8 who have played handbells before or who demonstrate the ability to read music and quickly master basic ringing technique. We can accommodate 14-20 ringers.

Our first goal is to prepare to ring in concerts and at the Junior High Handbell Festival. Another goal is to prepare our 8th grade ringers for our High School ensembles, Subito and Bellissimo. We aim to be proficient in music and ringing skills up to Level 3 , and 4 . Our rehearsal time is valuable-students should be on time and ready to put $100 \%$ effort into each rehearsal.

All students are expected to help set up and break down our equipment after performances. We need parents to help move equipment and students for some performances away from RAA.

Music, exercises, theory handouts and quizzes are chosen to teach, rehearse and assess student proficiency in all handbell techniques of Levels 1, 2, 3 and 4.

Level 1 - No bell changes, only quarter, half and whole notes, only $4 / 4,3 / 4$, and $2 / 4$ meter, only bell articulations that do not require the bell to leave the hand, slow to moderate tempo.

Level 2 - Everything from level one plus, cut time, 3/2 and simple mixed meter, eighth notes and dotted quarter followed by an eighth, pick up notes, PL, Mart-lift, malleting, a limited number of bell changes - with adequate preparation time, two different dynamic levels at the same time, slow to moderate tempo.

Level 3 - Everything from levels one and two plus: 6/8, $3 / 4$ (with one pulse per measure), $3 / 8,9 / 8,12 / 8$ and $6 / 4$, sixteenth notes, triplets, syncopation (not extreme), moderate number of bell changes, a combination of techniques - but not more than two per measure, more variety in dynamics and accents, slow to fast tempo with some changes within the piece.

Level 4 - Everything from levels one, two and three plus: mixed meters, faster tempi, triplets over two beats, more complex syncopation, brush damp, extensive number of bell changes per ringer, more shifts of dynamic levels, more changes of tempo.

Grades are based on three criteria:

- $40 \%$ of your grade is based on participation in rehearsals. Students are expected to be on time to rehearsals and to demonstrate respect and effort.
- $20 \%$ of your grade is based on theory assignments and tests.
- $40 \%$ of your grade is based on participation in performances. This includes being properly dressed, being on time, and being prepared. All members of Soundwave are equally important for an excellent performance.
